

## **Before Starting the Project Listings for the CoC Priority Listing**

**The FY 2016 CoC Consolidated Application requires TWO submissions. Both this Project Priority Listing AND the CoC Application MUST be submitted prior to the CoC Program Competition deadline as required by the FY 2016 CoC Program Competition NOFA.**

The FY 2016 CoC Priority Listing includes the following:

- Reallocation forms – must be fully completed if the CoC is reallocating eligible renewal projects to create new permanent housing – permanent supportive housing or rapid rehousing, new HMIS, or new SSO specifically for Coordinated Entry projects.
- New Project Listing – lists all new project applications created through reallocation and the permanent housing bonus that have been approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- Renewal Project Listing – lists all eligible renewal project applications that have been approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- UFA Costs Project Listing – applicable and only visible for Collaborative Applicants that were designated as a Unified Funding Agency (UFA) during the FY 2016 CoC Program Registration process. Only 1 UFA Costs project application is permitted and can only be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant.
- CoC Planning Project Listing – Only 1 CoC planning project is permitted per CoC and can only be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant.
- Grant Inventory Worksheet (GIW) – Collaborative Applicants must attach the final HUD-approved GIW.
- HUD-2991, Certification of Consistency with the Consolidated Plan – Collaborative Applicants must attach an accurately completed, signed, and dated HUD-2991.

Things to Remember:

- All new and renewal projects must be approved and ranked or rejected on the Project Listings.
- Collaborative Applicants are responsible for ensuring all project applications are accurately appearing on the Project Listings and there are no project applications missing from one or more Project Listings.
- Collaborative Applicants are strongly encouraged to list all project applications on the FY 2016 CoC Ranking Tool located on the FY 2016 CoC Program Competition: Funding Availability page on the HUD Exchange as this will greatly simplify and assist Collaborative Applicants while ranking projects in e-snaps by ensuring no rank numbers or duplicated and that all rank numbers are consecutive (e.g., no missing rank numbers).
- If a project application(s) is rejected by the CoC, the Collaborative Applicant must notify the affected project applicant(s) no later than 15 days before the CoC Program Competition application deadline outside of e-snaps and include the reason for rejection.
- For each project application rejected by the CoC the Collaborative Applicant must select the reason for the rejection from the dropdown provided.
- If the Collaborative Applicant needs to amend a project application for any reason after ranking has been completed, the ranking of other projects will not be affected: however, the Collaborative Applicant MUST ensure the amended project is returned to the applicable Project Listing AND re-rank the project application BEFORE submitting the CoC Priority Listing to HUD in e-snaps.



## **St. Joseph County Homeless Continuum of Care FY 2016 CoC Competition Project Ranking and Descriptions**

1. Center for the Homeless – SJC HMIS (\$140,596): HUD-required data collection and analysis project.
2. City of South Bend – Oaklawn Shelter + Care (\$286,284): A scattered site permanent supportive housing voucher program serving severely mentally ill and dually diagnosed (typically mental illness and addiction) individuals. More than 1/3 of the beds are set aside for chronically homeless.
3. Oaklawn Supportive Housing Rental Assistance (\$102,644): A scattered site permanent supportive housing voucher program serving severely mentally ill and dually diagnosed (typically mental illness and addiction) individuals.
4. AIDS Ministries/AIDS Assist PSH AMAA (\$124,236): Both a scattered site and facility-based permanent supportive housing project for homeless individuals diagnosed with HIV and AIDS.
5. LTC Rental Assistance II (\$165,814): A facility-based permanent supportive housing program for chronically homeless individuals experiencing addiction.
6. CFH Scattered Site PSH (\$84,662): A scattered site leasing project for chronically homeless individuals.
7. YWCA Samaritan Housing (\$92,136): A permanent supportive housing facility-based project for homeless women experiencing physical and/or psychiatric disabilities and who benefit from living in community in order to maintain housing stability. Fifty percent of the beds have been set aside for chronically homeless women.
8. CFH Permanent Housing (\$96,663): Permanent Housing (\$94,983): Both a scattered site and facility-based permanent supportive housing program for individuals with disabilities and families in which the head of household is disabled.
9. Oaklawn Turnock Group Home (\$116,155): A permanent housing facility for homeless individuals experiencing serious mental illness and who require a higher level of supervision and would benefit from living in community in order to maintain housing stability. Serves a minimum of 2 chronically homeless individuals.
10. YWCA Permanent Housing for Women w/ Disabilities (\$60,838): A permanent supportive housing site-based project for 8 chronically homeless women experiencing physical and/or psychiatric disabilities and who benefit from living in community in order to maintain housing stability.
11. CFH Family RRH (\$46,963): A scattered site rental assistance project for homeless families with low barriers to self-sufficiency.
12. CFH Scattered Site PSH II (\$124,400): A scattered site leasing project for chronically homeless individuals.
13. *Bonus Project* YWCA Rapid Rehousing (\$98,207): A scattered site rental assistance project for homeless families with low barriers to self-sufficiency.
